

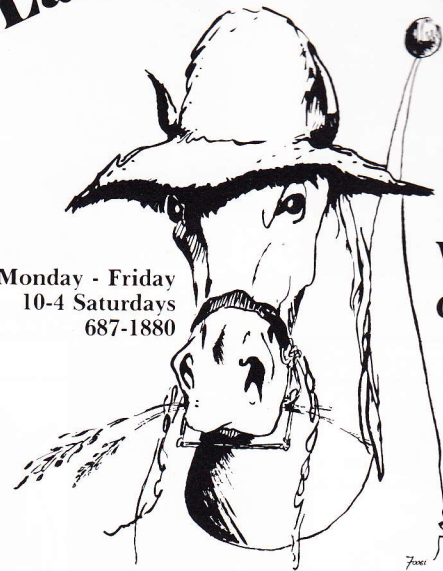

**1986 HONORARY VAQUERO  
JACK CRAWFORD**

The Santa Barbara Fiesta Rodeo & Stock Show is proud to present J.V. (Jack) Crawford as its 1986 Honorary Vaquero.

Jack has been a part of Santa Barbara County's ranching history for most of 79 years. Jack, a native of Los Angeles, spent his early school years in Glendale, California, and graduated from Stanford University in the late '20's. But it was in 1927 when Jack's mother, Nan

Vickers Crawford (of Vail and Vickers, owners of Santa Rosa Island in the Santa Barbara Channel), purchased the San Lucas Ranch in the Santa Ynez Valley that Crawford realized his 'true love of the land'--where raising cattle and ranching would be his life's work. The San Lucas Ranch, along with J.J. Mitchell's Juan and Lolita Ranch, were part of an original Spanish Land Grant, Las Lomas de la Purification, and Jack has taken great pride in helping to keep his ranch in the true tradition of the Old Spanish Ranchos.

When Mrs. Crawford purchased her portion of the Land Grant, she acquired 7,000 acres, but in later years Jack has increased the San Lucas Ranch to 10,000 acres of farming land, river bottom, rolling hills and mountain terrain. Crawford has maintained an active cattle business through good times and bad, dry years and floods.

Jack Crawford has been very active over the years in matters other than farming and cattle business. He was with the U.S. Air Force in some capacity for 23 years, spanning from before World War II to recent times and flying is as natural to Jack as driving a car. Crawford served two terms on the Santa Barbara Historical Society board of directors and for nine years on the board of trustees of the Santa Ynez Valley High School. Jack has been a member of the Rancheros Visitadores since its beginning and is now the last surviving charter member of the original Rancharo Ride.

Jack Crawford is making his entrance into the arena on a Delivery Wagon pulled by two Belgian draft horses, owned by Bob and Nancy Mastagni, of Santa Barbara, with Bob at the reins.
